


RICK'S CAFE HAS PLAYED AN INTEGRAL ROLE IN SHAPING JAMAICA'S INTERNATIONAL PROFILE

OUR HISTORY

Richard Hershman, discovered this beautiful cliffside location. At that time, Negril was still a sleepy fishing village with little development and few modern amenities. The land was originally owned by a local doctor, son of independent Jamaica's first Governor General. This iconic cliff side location became the first public bar and restaurant on the West End cliffs, boasting an unrivalled view of the sunset. Rick's Cafe quickly became a premiere gathering spot. We are proud to be recognized as a Jamaican Tradition for residents and visitors alike. September 1988, Hurricane Gilbert completely destroyed Rick's Cafe, bringing waves of over 25 ft. Rebuilt and stronger than ever, Rick's Cafe enjoyed 16 years until September of 2004. Hurricane Ivan roared through, the most destructive storm to date. Record waves of 80 ft. reduced Rick's Cafe to kindling wood. Once again, we rebuilt Rick's Cafe and are now bigger and better than ever. The Rick's Family includes a staff of 115 to serve our guests and to maintain the 1.5 acre property. Many of our staff have been part of the family for more than 30 years. President of Rick's Cafe, Tom Martin, moved to Negril in 1973 and partnered with Hershman soon after. He is full of stories of the early days and happy to share them. Our entire Rick's Family welcome you and hope your visit will be very memorable.

Richard Hershman, and partners Larry Swartz and Lester Grossman, bought a 1.5-acre property along the 35-foot cliff edge on the West End in the early 70s. The previous owner Dr. Winston Clifford was a Grange Hill doctor. The property had a cottage, garage and a swimming pool and was used as a weekend getaway by the doctor and his family. While building their restaurant and bar the partners stayed at Daniel Connell's nearby Palm Grove Cottage. Rick's Café opened in April 1974 and has maintained much of the original ambience despite some major setbacks. The early days were sometimes challenging; water, ice and beer were often in short supply. Ice was purchased twenty miles away in Savana-la-Mar. Beer would occasionally come from local grocers and the water supply for the whole of the west end was, and still, not always reliable.

Telephone service for the west end did not arrive until 1985. However, by that time Rick's was the go-to place in Negril. With the opening of Hedonism Il tour buses arrived every evening and celebrities made frequent appearances,

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including Ringo Starr, John Candy, Chevy Chase, and Ronnie Wood from the Rolling Stones.

In September 1988 Hurricane Gilbert paid a visit with waves crashing ashore at up to 25 feet above the cliffs, felling every power pole in the West End. Gilbert also destroyed Rick's Café, but the venue was quickly rebuilt. Then, in September 2004 Hurricane Ivan* came to town, again destroying Rick's with even bigger waves, this time throwing pieces of debris across the road. And that swimming pool which had been converted into a lower level bar was also taken away by Ivan. For a second time Rick's would rise like a phoenix, and the beat goes on. As Tom Martin, a long-time employee, says, "I am working at my third Rick's. This property just keeps on giving!" and businesses in the Negril area.




